Extraordinary Faith Mission Celebration with Bishop Sally Dyck

Sunday, September 16 at 8:00, 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. at Barrington UMC

n Sunday, September 16, Bishop Sally Dyck will be in worship at Barrington UMC to present the congregation with two awards for mission giving from the Northern Illinois Conference. In 2015, 2016 and 2017, Barrington UMC received the Phillip Otterbein Award for the highest mission giving by a single church. At the June Annual Conference, Barrington UMC was presented with both the Otterbein Award and, also, the John Wesley Award for the highest mission giving per member in 2017.

To be eligible for these honors, a church must pay 100% of its apportionment — the connectional portion of our annual budget – which supports United Methodist efforts around the world including agencies, universities, seminaries, new churches and new Christians.

The church must also participate in each band of the Rainbow Covenant mission giving program -- which BUMC has done every year since the inception of Rainbow Covenant. We support international missions, UMCOR and other relief and development efforts, national UM ministries, conference and district level missions and global missionaries in our budget each year. These missions and ministries are vetted through the UMC Advance. More information about this 'Second Mile Giving' can be found online on the Serving Opportunities page of the Barrington UMC website or in the booklet 'Making a Difference Through Gifts' available at the Welcome Table or in the office.

Among the mission giving not included in these numbers is our giving to local Barrington agencies including Samaritan Counseling, the Barrington Area Coalition

on Aging, JourneyCare, Habitat, local food pantries and others. The very generous in-kind donations that our members give throughout the year are also a great cause for celebration – the Christmas gifts for ChildServ and the Early Learning Center, hygiene kits that go to Nicasa for residents of halfway houses, Treats for Troops, various gift cards, donations of food for the Food Pantry, Backpacks for ChildServ, and more.

Also vitally important to the Christian journey, are the many hours members spend in service to the community. Members serve locally through Meals with Wheels, USO at O'Hare, the Congregational Garden, the Community Meal, the UMW Rummage Sale, Kids Hope USA, Habitat for Humanity, and many other efforts too numerous to mention. In 2018, BUMC and First UMC West Dundee can celebrate four transformational mission trips – our tweens worked and learned to St. Louis, our teens explored social justice in Washington D.C., a group of adults and college students spent a week at Tree of Life Ministries in Mission, South Dakota and another group of adults will travel to Mixco, Guatemala in November. The testimonies from these trips tell the stories of lives changed by the experience.

Here's to a New Year of Youth Ministry!

bout one year ago, in mid-October, our multisite youth group was getting ready to go to a corn maze. I was still pretty new as a pastoral intern, but SO excited to do a #funfallactivity with the youth. And then, it rained... buckets. Our youth team figured it would be no fun to walk around in the mud and the rain, so we needed a Plan B. I decided to take some initiative and find an alternative for our tweens and youth. I made some calls, and found a place that had, as they said on the phone, "spooky laser tag." Laser tag with pumpkins and bats, I assumed. Perfect! As we drove up to laser tag, sprinting through the rain to get inside, I instantly knew that "spooky" was an understatement. In fact, maybe too

scary to be appropriate to anyone under the age of 12. Laser tag with pumpkins and bats quickly became a full-fledged haunted house with giant laser guns as defense... if you dared to enter. We had three brave youth go through the haunted house with an adult, and based on numbers, Pastor Carol and I had to go in alone. After 15 minutes of sheer torture, running for our lives, shooting lasers at zombies who kept coming back to life, getting whacked in the face with Pastor Carol's laser, we made it out pale as ghosts.

This first year as a pastoral intern, and now youth director, has been filled with laughs, memories, and even some mistakes like this spooky laser tag misunderstanding. It has been a joy



and privilege to get to know our youth through mission trips, youth group, Harry Potter lock-ins, summer bible studies, mission fundraisers, and more. As our fall program launches, I can't help but think of all that is yet to come.

When I attended church as a youth, I remember thinking "I just need to make it to youth group ... " or "I can't wait for the next mission trip ...". Because youth group and all its events was a moment of pause; a moment where I didn't need to stress about homework, exams, sports and drama. A moment where I didn't need to prove myself to anyone. A moment where I was with people who wanted to be a part of a community and have big and sometimes tough conversations. A moment where I was known by a God who loved me and welcomes me home time and time again.

This year, we are going to relaunch our multisite youth group for 3rd-12th graders. We will have youth group on Sundays starting September 9th from 6:00–7:30 p.m. at BUMC. We will choose a new name for our youth group that reflects First UMC of West Dundee, Barrington UMC, Cristiano Comunidad, and all our future church partnerships. We will have Coffee, Cocoa, and Homework Hangs on Mondays from 3:30–6:00 p.m. at the Well at BUMC. We will have a Fall Retreat at Covenant Harbor in Lake Geneva October 19th-21st. (Turn to page 8 for more details). But more than anything we will have moments of laughter as we build community and learn each other's stories. We will have moments that turn into memories that impact us and our faith forever. We will maybe make some more mistakes as we grow a new program, but just like spooky laser tag and like our God, sometimes our mistakes turn into the best parts.

Our multisite pastors and staff are committed to our youth. Our Family Ministries team is envisioning a sustainable cradle-to-college program. Our Youth Lay Team is already showing up at events, being role models for our youth. What we need now is you ... youth, parents, families, friends to make this program run. Whether it be youth attending the events or parents helping make dinner for Confirmation, driving our youth to (hopefully!!) a corn maze, or becoming a role model at youth group, we need you. Our church is only as strong as our youth, and our youth are only as strong as the volunteers who make the program possible. Thank you to those who have already served, and those who will in the future. Here's to a new year filled with laughs, memories and maybe some spooky laser tag



Disciple III begins September 5






Disciple IV begins September 13

ChildServ Celebration

On July 22nd, Barrington UMC welcomed Dan Kotowski, CEO of ChildServ, to share with us in worship and over lunch. He shared both his personal experiences with youth at ChildServ's group homes and the impressive work that is done with young families through the Parent Empowerment Program and ChildServ's foster and adoption programs. He offered thanks for our continued support of these families and youth.

On Tuesday, July 31st, members of BUMC sent 50 backpacks and many more school supplies as well as a \$1000 donation to the Back to School Backpack program.

Members of First UMC West Dundee knew in July that their ChildServ Back to School Backpack Drive was coming in August. One mom had this in mind when, on Sunday afternoon, July 22nd, she sent a group text letting church members know that Verizon in West Dundee was giving out FREE backpacks with some supplies included.
